Kyowa Hakko Bio's 2'-Fucosyllactose Receives Approval by FSSAI in India

(Kyowa Hakko Bio), a subsidiary of Kirin Holdings Company, Limited, is pleased to announce that its 2'-Fucosyllactose (2'-FL), a Human Milk Oligosaccharide (HMO), has granted approval on September 2nd, 2024 as Food Ingredients by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) ¹⁾. This marks a significant milestone as it is the first HMO from KYOWA HAKKO BIO to receive recognition in the Indian market.

India, with its high population and projected growth over the next few decades, presents a promising opportunity for the incorporation of our HMOs. According to the United Nations, India has had the highest population in the world since 2023 and is expected to continue growing for the next 40 years²⁾. Moreover, India's position as the world's fifth-largest economy by nominal GDP and the increasing awareness of nutrition and fitness among the population indicate a substantial and sustained demand for safe nutrition for people of all ages in India³⁾⁴⁾.
